The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, USDA APHIS PPQ, and the National Plant Board invite you to attend the **2009 National Plant Board in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma from Sunday through Thursday, August 9<sup>th</sup> - August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2009**. See the draft agenda for the educational, informative program planned for safeguarding agriculture. There is so much to do while you are here: Bricktown District, the Oklahoma City National Memorial, Oklahoma History Center, National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum, Myriad Botanical Gardens and Crystal Bridge Conservatory, and much more.

### Accommodations:

The meeting will be held at the **Sheraton Oklahoma City Hotel**, One North Broadway, Oklahoma City, OK 73102 (405-235-2780). Guests must make their own reservations by calling **1-800-325-3535** and reserve as members of the **National Plant Board Conference** or by using the direct link available on the **NPB Website**: [www.nationalplantboard.org/meetings](http://www.nationalplantboard.org/meetings).

The hotel room rate for the conference is **\$83.00**, plus current state and local taxes of **13.875%**. Reservations deadline is **July 10, 2009. PLEASE MAKE YOUR RESERVATIONS EARLY.** Reservations must be guaranteed with a major credit card. Individual reservations must be canceled at least five (5) business days prior to arrival date and cancellation number must be obtained by guest or a one night charge will be applied.

### Transportation:

Will Rogers World Airport is only 20 minutes from the Sheraton Hotel. Recommended transportation from Will Rogers Airport to the hotel is Airport Express, the blue vans found in the passenger loading area just outside baggage claim. Rates are \$22 per individual, \$12 per person for party of 2, and \$8 per person for party of 3 or more (subject to change). No reservations are required. Airport Express telephone is 405-681-3311 to schedule pickup for return flight.

### Meeting Registration:

**Things to Do:**

Oklahoma City is family-friendly! Visit the Oklahoma City Zoo & Botanical Gardens, Frontier City Theme Park, White Water Bay, Red Earth Museum, Rocktown Climbing Gym, Oklahoma Science Museum, or Stockyards City, a National Register Historic District. Take a water taxi ride along Bricktown Canal or rent a kayak or bicycle at the Chesapeake Boathouse and explore the 13+ miles of river trails.
