Aquaculture Tour

Join us for an eye-opening tour that will demonstrate the farming and processing of shellfish at the finest aquatic farms in the Pacific Northwest. Our first stop will be at the Taylor Shellfish Processing Plant where participants will see all aspects of this state-of-the-art facility from oyster shucking and packing, mussel and clam culling and packing, geoduck packing, freezing, and live shellfish holding tanks. Next participants will be transported to the Taylor Floating Upwell System (FLUPSY) on Oakland Bay, this nursery system holds and grows nearly one third of the oyster and clam seeds for west coast farmers. Xinh's Clam & Oyster House in Shelton is the next stop of the tour. Participants will enjoy fresh South Puget Sound shellfish dishes created by chef Xinh Dwelley (non-shellfish dishes available). From [Xinh's](#) the tour will continue to the Taylor Shellfish mussel farm with a boat ride to view raft cultures of Mediterranean mussels in Totten Inlet. We will then travel to Chelsea Farms where we will gather on the beautiful beach at Eld Inlet to see manila clam, oyster and geoduck aquaculture.

Transportation

Airline reservations should be made to fly into the SeaTac International Airport in Seattle, WA. A group rate has been provided to us for shuttle service from SeaTac International Airport to the hotel by Capital Aeroporter.
